NON-EMERGENCY ONLINE CRIME REPORTING - TPD VOLUNTEERING - MISCELLANEOUS INFORMATION

Here are a number of important and helpful announcements from the Tucson Police Department's Community Service Officer, Teresa Hayward. These include how to report crime online for non-emergencies, a call for volunteers to assist the TPD with patrol and support services, warrant court schedules, and the upcoming Coffee with a Cop.

Did you know the Tucson Police Department offers an online crime reporting system for non-emergencies? Although the ability to report certain crimes online has been available to the community since 2005, the Tucson Police Department recently enhanced the reporting system. The new system is more user-friendly and includes a step-by-step process for the user to follow.

The online crime reporting system offers a convenient method to quickly report specific non-emergency and non-life-threatening crimes that occurred within the city limits of Tucson. Don't worry if you are not sure what jurisdiction the incident occurred. The website allows you to verify the incident location and if the incident occurred outside of TPD's jurisdiction, you will be directed to the appropriate agency. A description for each of the crimes can be found by hovering over the category on the website. You can report the following crimes online:

- Civil matter
- Collision (no injuries)
- Convenience store burglary
- Damaged property
- Hate crime or bias where you will be directed to an individual page located at https://www.tucsonaz.gov/police/hate-crimes-and-bias-based-incidents
- Lost property
- Mandatory reporting for schools
- Non-criminal death case
- Phone harassment
- Suspicious circumstances

• Theft categories - Theft - Bicycle theft - Theft from an automobile - Theft of auto accessories - Theft of services

• Trespassing
